- One of the most wooded landscapes in Britain
- A rare example of a more natural forest ecosystem
- Home to rare wildlife species
- A living historic landscape which dates back to before medieval times
- An island of tranquillity in the built-up South East



The West Weald Landscape Project works to conserve and enhance the special natural environment of this area to promote:

1. Enhanced conservation of **four core forest areas**: Ebernoe, The Mens, Chiddingfold Forest and Greensand Woods
2. Improved **connections** and **sympathetic land management** across the whole landscape
3. Informed conservation from applied **research, surveys and monitoring**
4. Increased **enjoyment, understanding, and involvement** of the public
